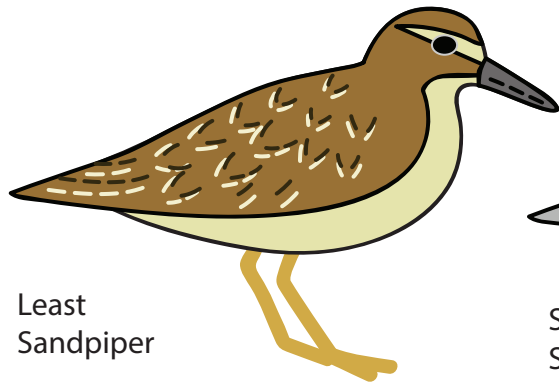
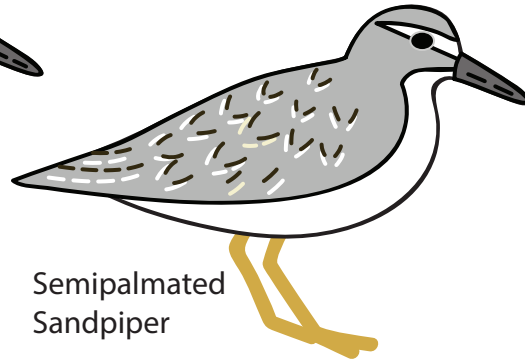


# Downeast Thunder Farm Sandpiper

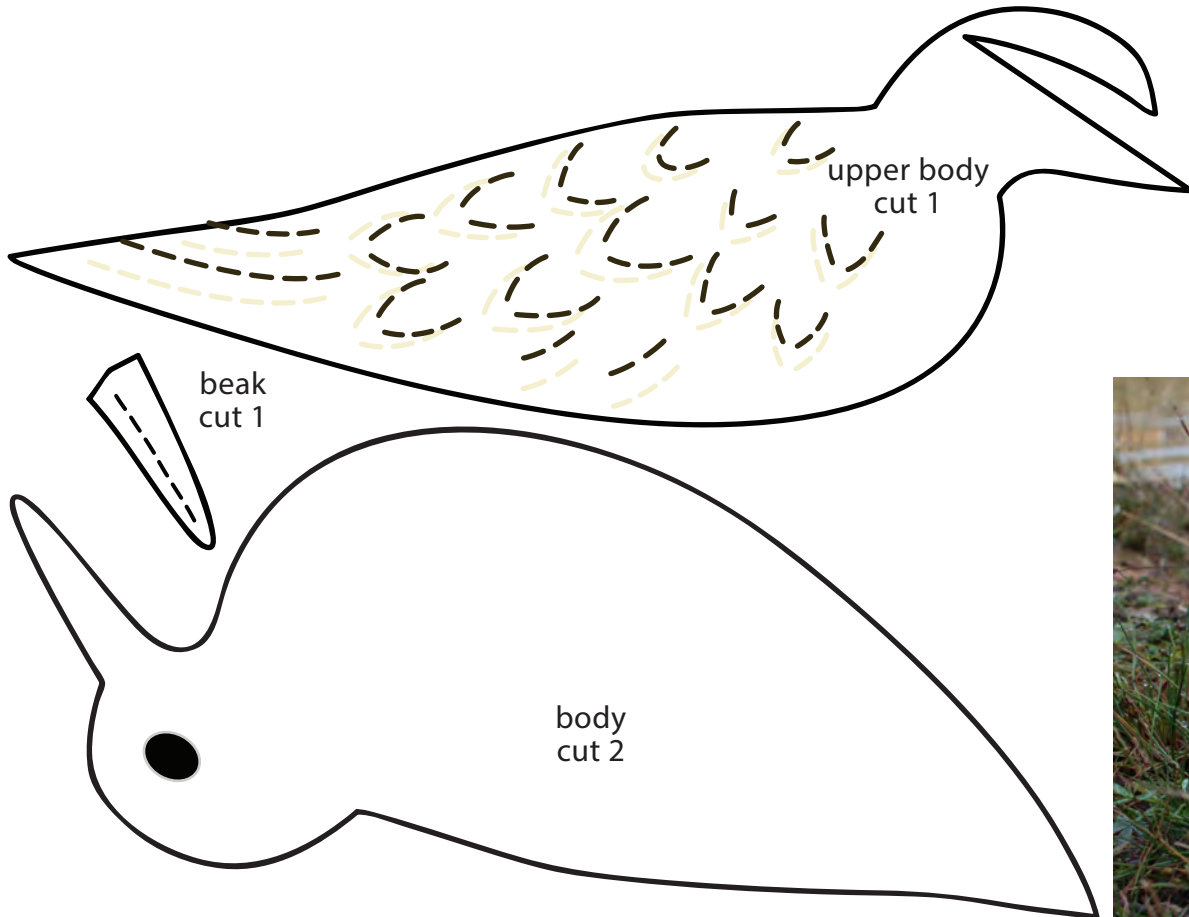
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Least Sandpiper



Semipalmated Sandpiper



I used the same pattern for both varieties of Sandpiper. For the Least Sandpiper I selecte felt in off-white and light brown. For the Semipalmated Sandpiper I selected white and light gray. The beak for each is in a medium gray felt.

Pin the upper body to the body front. Add the decorative stitching with three strands of black emboidery floss and one strand of white floss.

For the eye, cut a small circle of black felt; tack into place on the face. Tack the beak on with a running stich.

Sew the two body pieces together with a blanket stitch. Pause before finishing to stuff with fiberfill.

I used wire to form the legs and tucked it between the body pieces and tacked into place with a few stitches.
