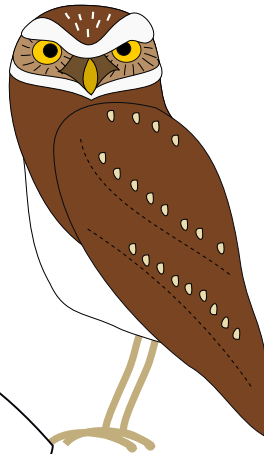
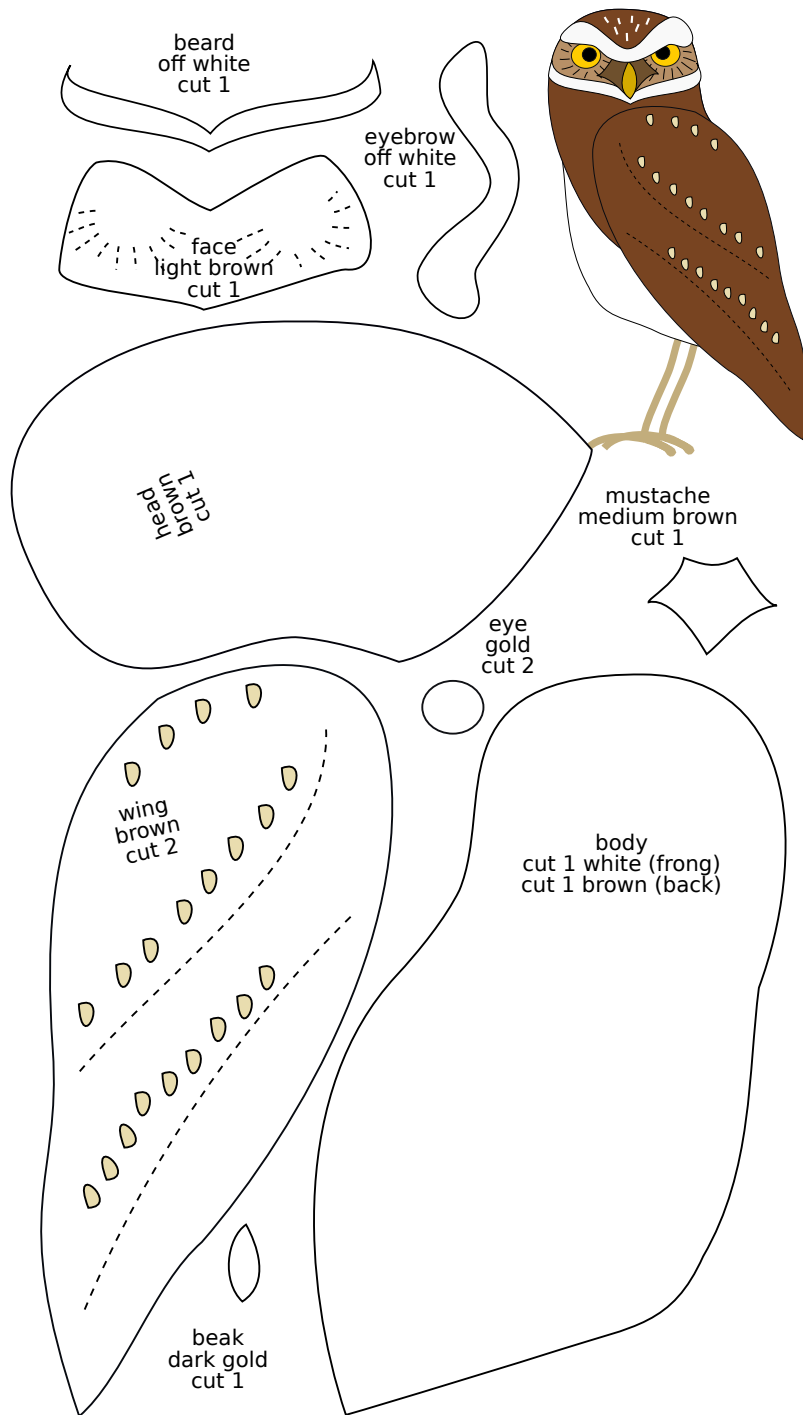


# Downeast Thunder Farm Burrowing Owl

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Position the face and head on the white body front; pin. Add the beard and tack. Add the mustache and beak; tack with a running stitch down the center of the beak. Position the eyes and tack with two-to-three French knots in black. Position the eyebrows slightly overlapping the eyes and tack with a running white stitch around the edges. Add the decorative stitching to the face with brown floss. Add a few small stitches in white to the forehead.

Position the beak and add the decorative stitching. I created the white dots with small laisy daisy stitches. Do the same to the wing on the mirror side of the brown body piece.

If desired, fashion legs from wire and tack onto the wrong side of the body. Pin the body front and back together and sew around the edges with a blanket stitch using brown floss, pausing to stuff with fiberbill before completing.
