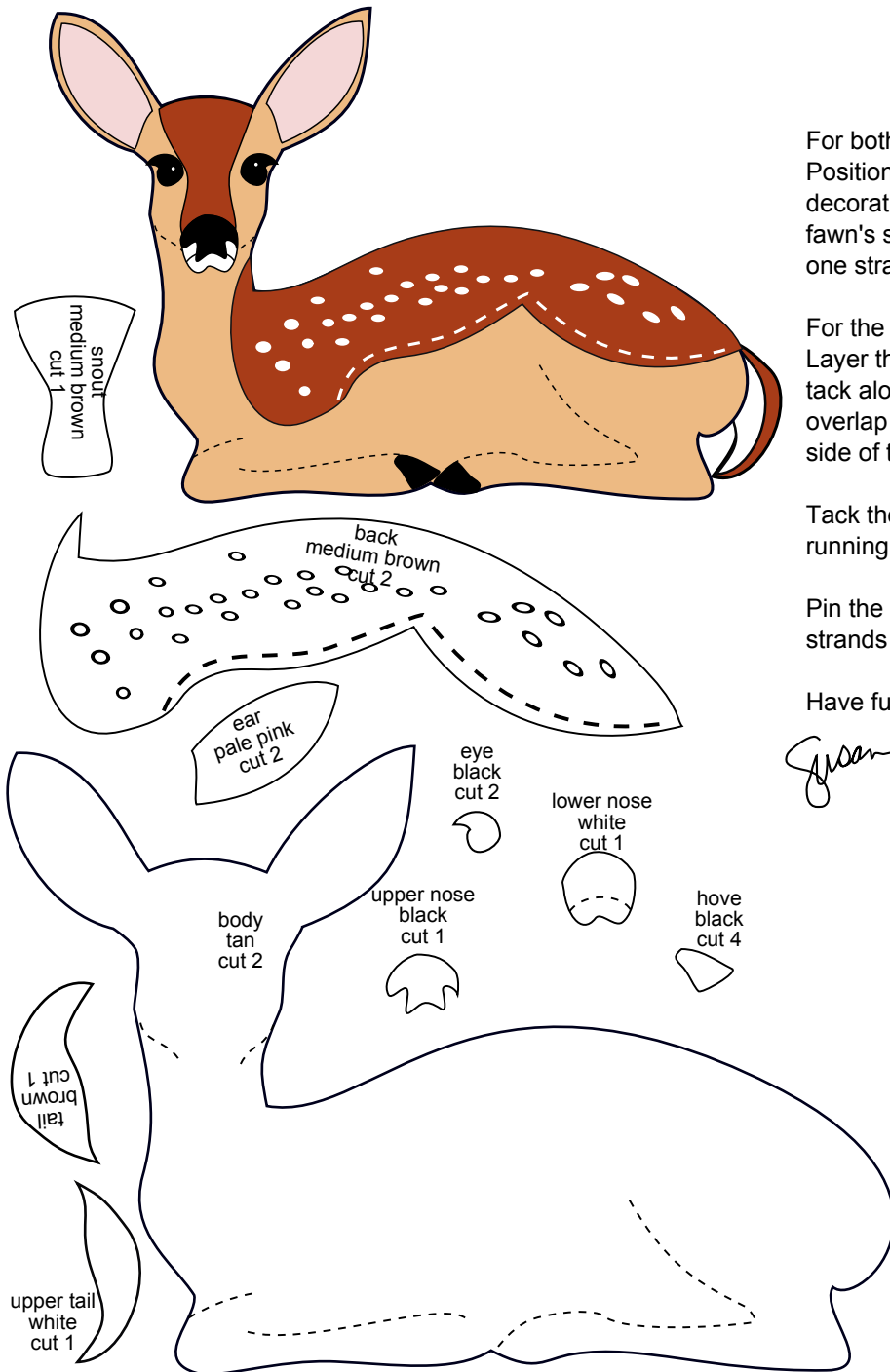


Downeast Thunder Farm Deer

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For both sides of the fawn:

Position the back on the body; tack along the inner edges. Along the belly portion add the decorative running stitch in white using two strands of embroidery floss. Make French knots for the fawn's spots. Tack the hooves in place and add the decorative stitching that defines the legs using one strand of black embroidery floss.

For the fawn's front:

Layer the tail top on the tail. Tack the tail to the wrong side of the body front. Position the face; tack along the outer edges using a matching floss. Position the Nose and the upper nose so they overlap the face slightly. Tack using one strand of black embroidery floss. Add the stitch to either side of the upper nose to form the mouth.

Tack the eyes into place using a French knot in white. Position the ears. Tack in place with a running stitch up the center.

Pin the body front and back together and sew the edges together with a blanket stitch using two strands of brown floss. Pause to stuff lightly with fiberfill before completing.
