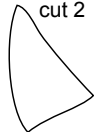
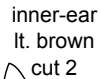
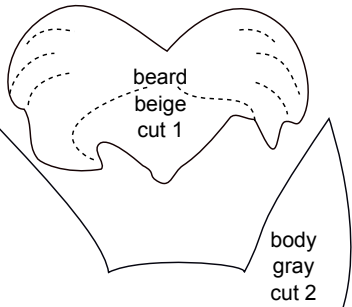
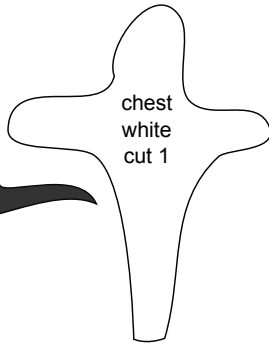


# Downeast Thunder Farm Gidget Puppy

## A Note on Copyright

I am happy to share this pattern with you for your personal, not-for-profit use. You are encouraged to make these in any form (ornaments, felting, quilting, applique, etc.) and sell for non-profit fund-raising. You may not redistribute the patterns without express written permission or sell the patterns.

The colors on this pattern match my Gidget Yorkie/Mini Schnauzer puppy, but you can mix up the colors any way you like.

Note: I used one strand of floss throughout the body front. I used two strands of floss for the edge blanket stitching.

Begin with the body front by positioning the chest and attach with a running stitch using white floss around the edges. Position the head and pin. Position the beard and pin. Position the nose and tongue so that the nose overlaps the tongue. Sew around the edges of the nose with a black running stitch. Cut circles for the eyes and tack into place. With black floss, add the decorative stitches that create the eyelashes. Add the face and beard decorative stitching in black.

Decide if you want the ears to stand straight or flop down. If they will both stand straight, position the inner-ear piece on each ear and tack in place. If you're going to have an ear flop, don't use the inner-ear piece or you'll end up with too much felt when you try to fold the ear.

Pin the body front and back together. If you're going to fold one or both of the ears down, now's the time to do it. Fold the ear until you like the position and tack down.

Sew the edges together with a blanket stitch, pausing to stuff with fiberfill before completing.
