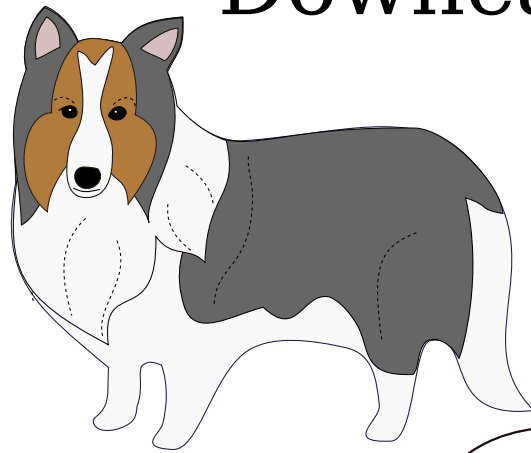


Downeast Thunder Farm Bruno

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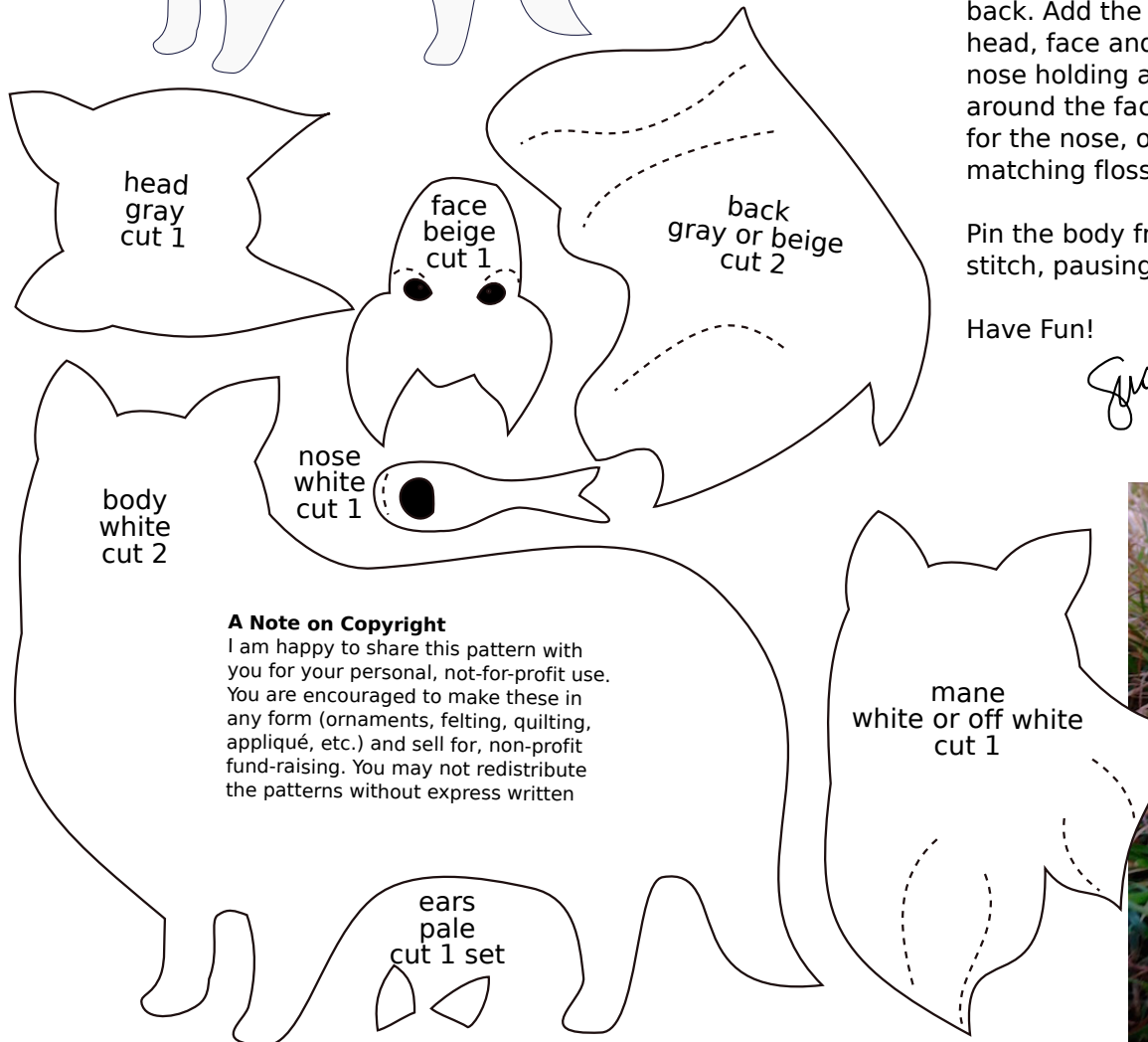


The colors on this pattern match my nephew's "Bruno" Sheltie, but you can mix up the colors any way you like. I used one strand of floss on the body and two strands when sewing the edges together.

Sew the back onto the body pieces. The back of the dog uses only the back piece. Use a running stitch in matching floss along the outer edges of the back. Add the decorative stitching with a contrasting color floss. Layer on the head, face and nose. Sew a running stitch in white around the edge of the nose holding all layers into place. Using matching floss, sew a running stitch around the face. Use French knots in black for the eyes. Cut an oval in black for the nose, or sew on the nose with a satin stitch. Sew on the ears with a matching floss. Add the decorative stitching to the mane and face.

Pin the body front and back together. Sew the edges together with a blanket stitch, pausing to stuff with fiberfill before completing.
