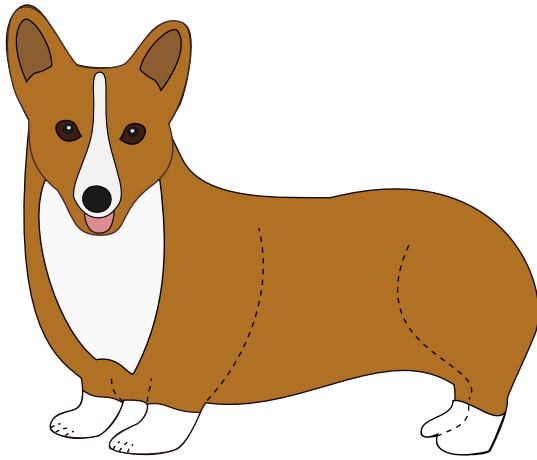


Downeast Thunder Farm Corgi

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The colors on this pattern match my friend's Oji corgi, but you can mix up the colors any way you like. Note: I used one strand of floss throughout the body front. I used two strands of floss for the edge blanket stitching.

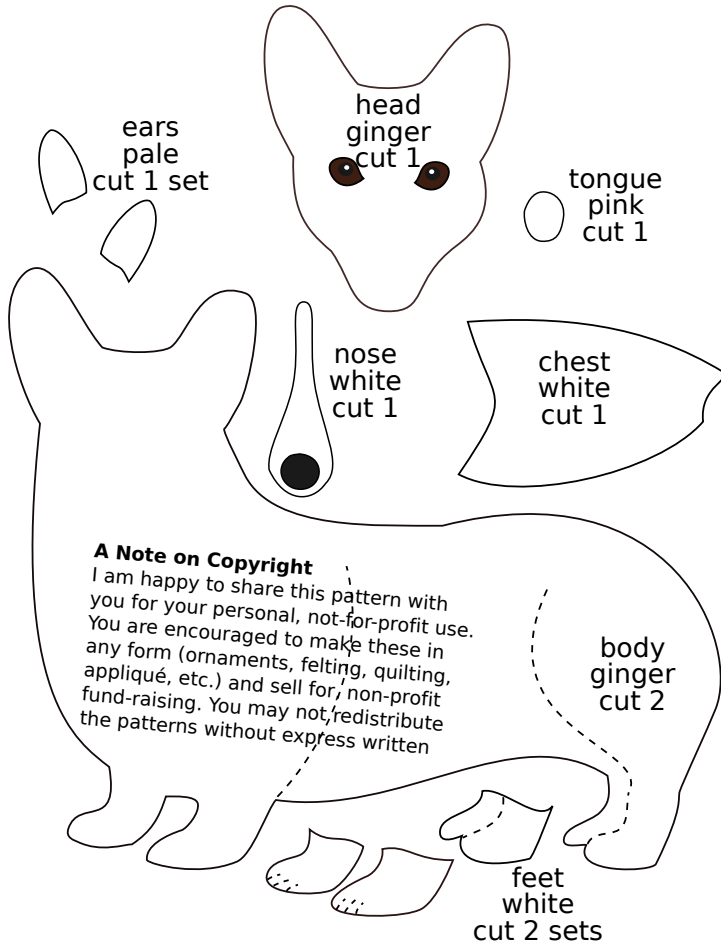
Begin with the body front by positioning the chest and attach with a running stitch using white floss around the edges. Position the head with the tongue and nose layered on top. Sew a running stitch in white around the edges of the nose. Cut a small circle of black felt for the nose. Sew on the ears with matching floss. Sew the eyes on with black floss - first create the outline and then fill the outline in with a satin stitch.

Tack the feet on the body front and back with matching floss. Add the body decorative stitching on both the body front and back in a black or a dark brown floss.

Pin the body front and back together. Sew the edges together with a blanket stitch, pausing to stuff with fiberfill before completing.
