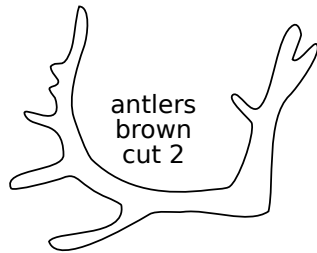
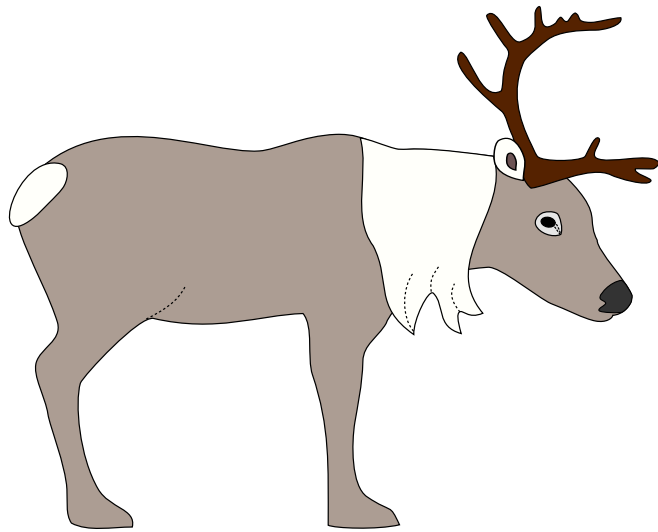


Downeast Thunder Farm Reindeer

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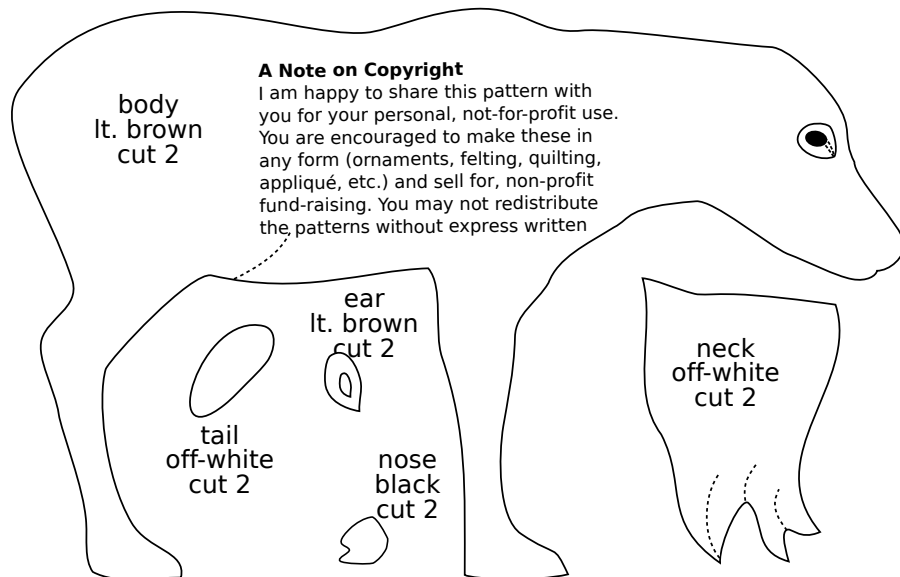
Create two mirror images for a double-sided reindeer. Note: I use two strands of floss throughout.

Cut an oval of off-white felt for the eye. Tack into place with a black satin stitch matching the pattern. Position the neck and tail; tack with matching floss. With your scissors, make some small snips to fringe the bottom edge of the neck.

For the antlers, match both pieces and using brown floss and sew a running stitch up the center, leaving the portion that sits on the head empty of stitches. Position the reindeer body front and back together; pin. Slide the antlers over the head; tack securely with brown floss. Position the ear so it overlaps the antlers slightly; tack with brown floss.

Sew the body front and back together with a blanket stitch in brown floss - begin and end on either side of the antlers. Sew under the tail. Pause before finishing to gently stuff with fiberfill. I tucked toothpicks in the legs for a bit more structure.
