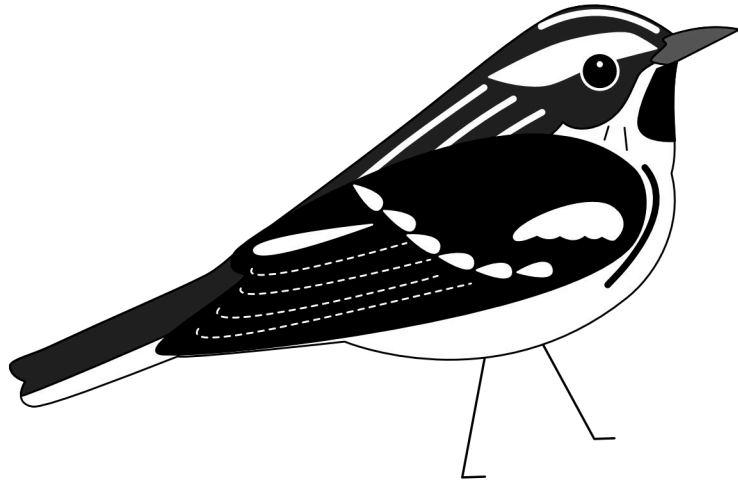


# Downeast Thunder Farm Black-and-white Warbler

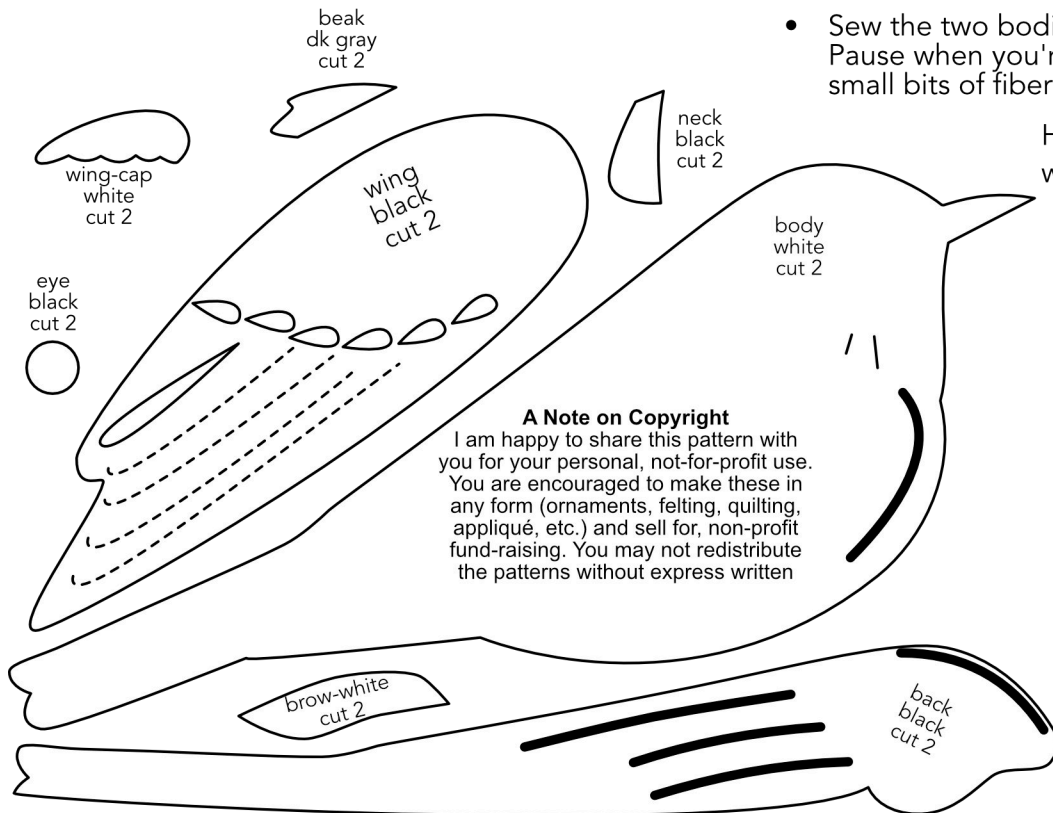
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- Create two mirror images for a double-sided ornament.
- Position the back; tack with a black running stitch. Position the neck; tack with one strand of black floss.
- Position the brow and tack with white floss. Position the eye overlapping the brow and sew with a white running stitch around the edge.
- Position the wing; sew the edges with a blanket stitch with two strands of black floss.
- Tack the wing cap with white floss. Using four strands of white floss, add the stitching to the head and the lazy daisy stitches to the wing. Use two strands of floss for the running stitches on the wing.
- Using black floss, add the backstitches to the belly (4 strands) and neck (2 strands).
- If desired, fashion legs from wire and tack them to the back of one of the bodies.
- Sew the two bodies together with a blanket stitch using two strands of black floss. Pause when you're about 1½" from finishing the blanket stitch. Lightly stuff with small bits of fiberfill; finish sewing the edge and tie it off.
