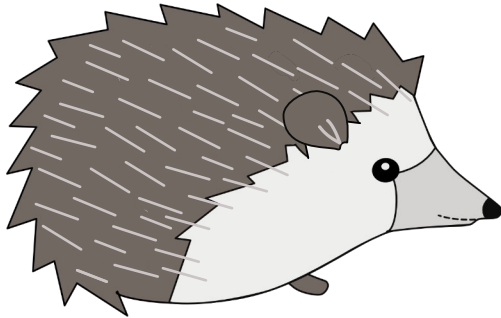


# Downeast Thunder Farm Hedgehog

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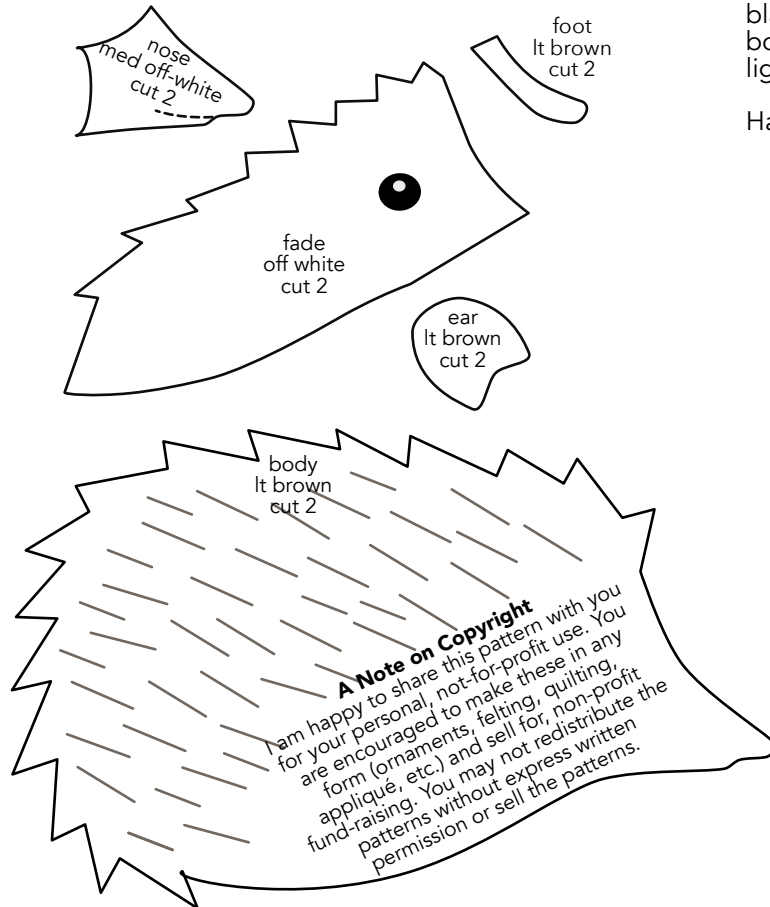
Create two mirror images of this hedgehog for a double-sided ornament. Layer the face and now on the body; pin. Note – I use two strands of embroidery floss throughout. Positioning the circle of black felt for the eye overlapping the nose slightly. Tack the eye in place and finish off with a clear or white seed bead, or a small white French knot. Create the mouth with a few stitched in black.

Create the quills with a series of long stitches of various lengths curving along the body. Use a natural colored floss for this phase.

Take the ear piece and bring the two bottom edges together to overlap. Tack with a stitch and then tack into place on the hedgehog body. Position the foot on the wrong side of the body and tack. Pin the body pieces together. Create the nose with a series of black stitches effectively sewing both body pieces together in the process. Sew the two body pieces together with a blanket stitch in the same natural colored floss, pausing to lightly stuff with fiberfill before finishing.
