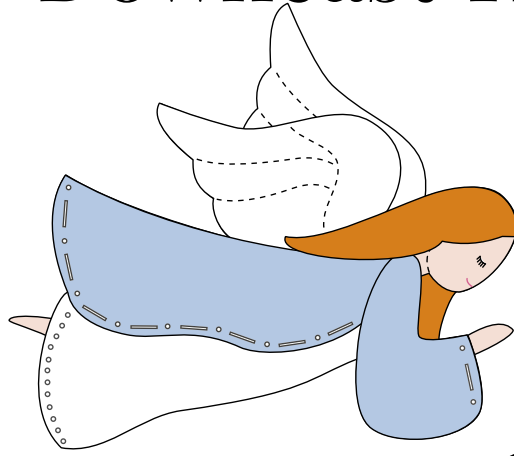


# Downeast Thunder Farm Christmas Angel

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Note: use two strands of floss unless otherwise noted. Position the Sew a white blanket stitch along the inside edge of the wing where it overlaps the wing body part. Using metallic thread or white floss, add the decorative stitching to the wings.

Position the small piece of hair and tack using brown floss. Position the head and tack with eye (black floss) and mouth (pink floss) stitches using one strand of floss for each. Add the the neck running stitch in white as outlined on the pattern. Position the robe; pin. Run white blanket stitch along the edge of the robe where it overlaps the skirt. Position the arm; pin. Run a white blanket stitch along the edges where it overlaps the hair, robe, and skirt. Line the opening edge of the robe and the sleeve with alternating white/clear seed and bugle beads.

Position the larger piece of hair over lapping the angel's wings and robe. Tack with a brown running stitch around the edge. Create the back side of the angel in mirror image to the one you just completed. Tack the hands and feet to the back side of one of the body pieces. Sew the two body pieces together with a white running stitch. Pause to gently stuff with fiberfill before completing. If desired, create a halo with a circle of wire and tack to the head.
