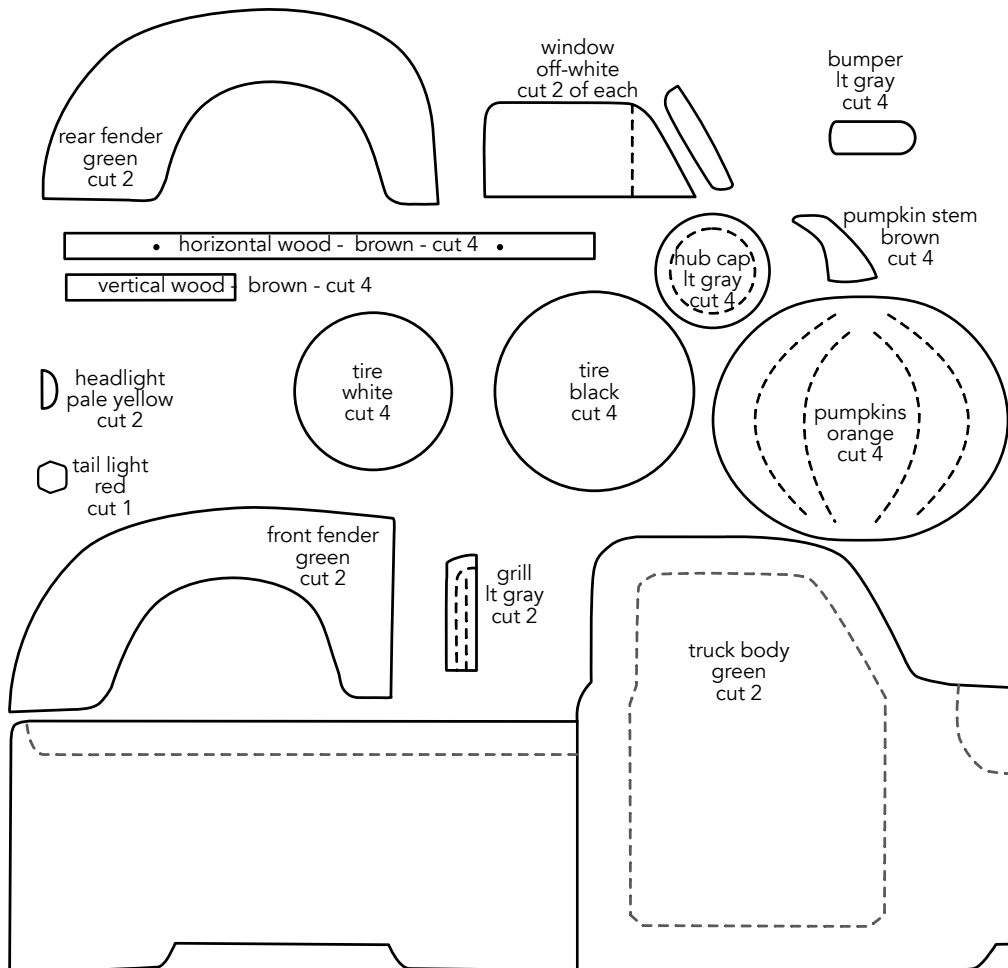
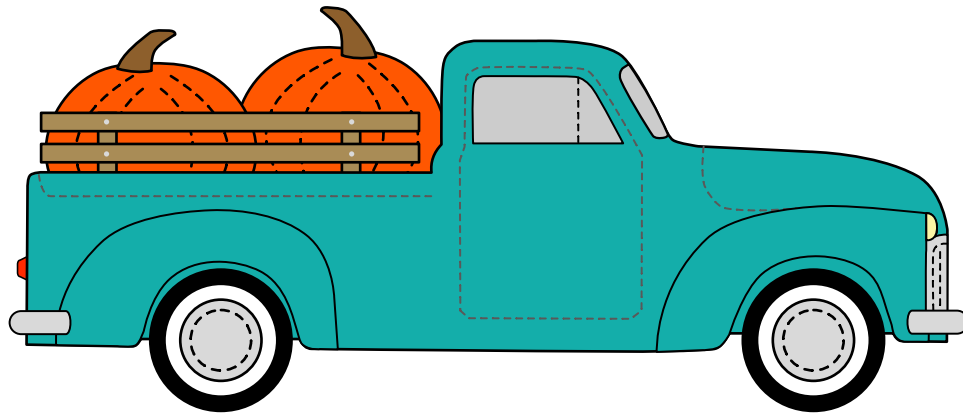


# Downeast Thunder Farm Vintage Autumn Truck

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Create two mirror images for a double-sided ornament. Use one strand of floss unless otherwise noted.

- Sew windows on with a white running stitch around the edge. Use black or gray for the decorative stitch on the side door window.
- Sew on fenders with a green running stitch around the edges.
- Sew a green backstitch on the truck body using two strands of floss to define where the truck bed meets the cab.
- Layer the black, white, and gray for the tires. Tack the gray with a black running stitch. Sew on the truck with a black running stitch.
- Position the grill and bumpers and tack with white floss.
- Add the brown decorative stitching to each pumpkin and tack the stem in place. Set aside.
- Arrange the wood pieces on the truck bed; tack with a French knot where the vertical and horizontal sections cross. Tack the unit to the back of the truck body.
- Arrange the pumpkins behind the wood rack. Tack the pumpkins to the horizontal wood pieces with tiny white stitches.
- With one strand of white floss, sew the running stitches along the top of the truck bed, around the door and the hood as illustrated.
- Tack the red taillight to the back of one body.
- If you are not going to stuff this ornament, tack a piece of wire bent in a zig-zag to the back of the truck body as I did for structure.
- Pin the body pieces together and sew with a blanket stitch using two strands of floss. Use matching floss for each section.
