



Downeast Thunder Farm Black-throated Blue Warbler

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- Cut two of all pattern pieces. Create two mirror images for a double-sided ornament.
- Position and tack the neck using black floss.
- Sew on the beak with a black running stitch for the mouth.
- Position the back and tack along the inside edge with gray floss.
- Using black floss, add the running stitch to the tail.
- Position the eye and tack with a gray backstitch around the edges. Finish off with a seed bead.
- Sew on the wing with a gray running stitch around the edge.
- Sew the cap on the wing with a gray blanket stitch. Add the lazy daisy stitches to the cap - the first white, the rest gray.
- Add the three white lazy daisy stitches to the wing and the gray running stitches. Add the two gray lazy daisy stitches to the belly.
- Add wire legs to the back of one body if desired.
- Sew the two bodies together with a blanket stitch - white along the belly, gray elsewhere, skipping the tail. Pause about 1½" from finishing the blanket stitch and lightly stuff with fiberfill. Finish sewing and tie-off.
