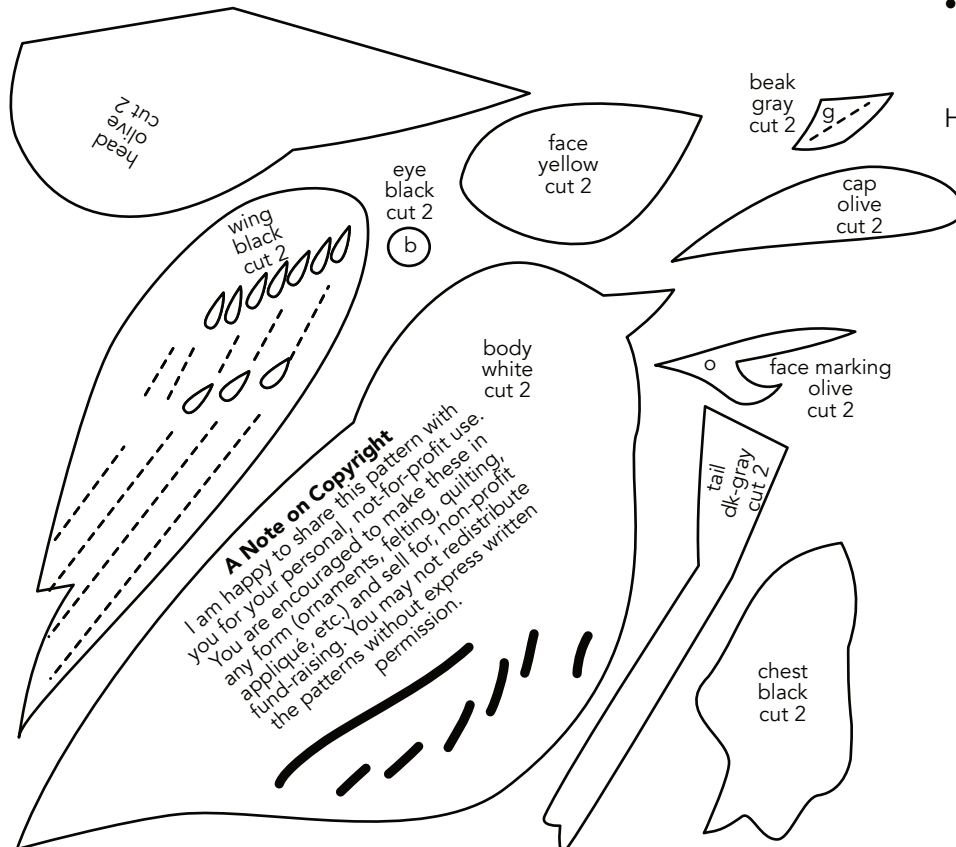
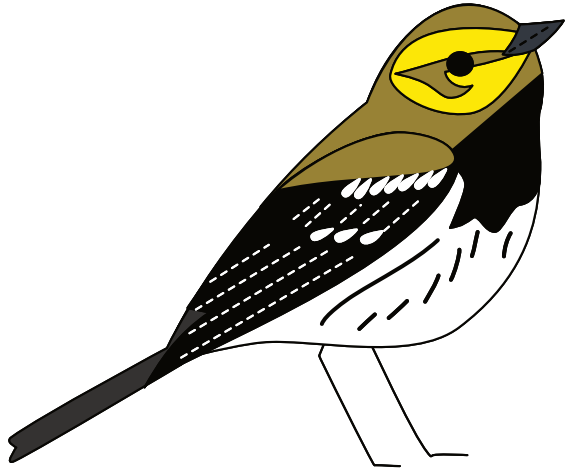


Downeast Thunder Farm Black-throated Green Warbler

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- Cut two of all pattern pieces. Create two mirror images for a double-sided ornament.
- Position and tack the neck using black floss.
- Position the back with one strand of black floss.
- Place the face and tack along the edges with yellow floss.
- Position the face markings and tack with yellow floss.
- Position the eye and tack. Finish off with a black seed bead.
- Sew on the beak with a black running stitch for the mouth.
- Position the tail and tack
- Sew on the wing with a black running stitch around the edge.
- Tack the cap on the wing with yellow floss.
- Add the white running and lazy daisy stitches to the wing with two strands of floss.
- Using six strands of black floss, add the belly markings with a split stitch.
- Add wire legs to the back of one body if desired.
- Sew the two bodies together with a blanket stitch - white along the belly, black elsewhere. Pause about 1½" from finishing the blanket stitch and lightly stuff with fiberfill. Finish sewing and tie-off.
