


# Downeast Thunder Farm Bobcat





- Position the ear tips on the head; tack with black floss. Position the ear-tufts; tack with white floss.
- Position the mouth and nose. Tack the nose with brown floss around the edges. Sew the black stitches on the mouth. Position the nose and tack.
- Position the eyes and iris; tack with a black seed bead or black French knot. Sew a black circle around the iris. Add the black stitches that run above the iris.
- Position the head on the body. Sew the decorative black and white running stitches on the head and the black lazy daisy stitches on the forehead as pictured.
- Position the chest and tack with white floss.
- Sew the black running stitches that define the legs. Position the spots and tack.
- Tack the tail to the outside of the back body—position small black spots on the tail and tack. Tack the ear tips on the back body. Cut and sew spots to the back if desired.
- Sew the two bodies together with a blanket stitch using two strands of brown floss. Pause when you're about 1½" from finishing the blanket stitch. Lightly stuff with small bits of fiberfill; finish sewing the edge and tie it off.
