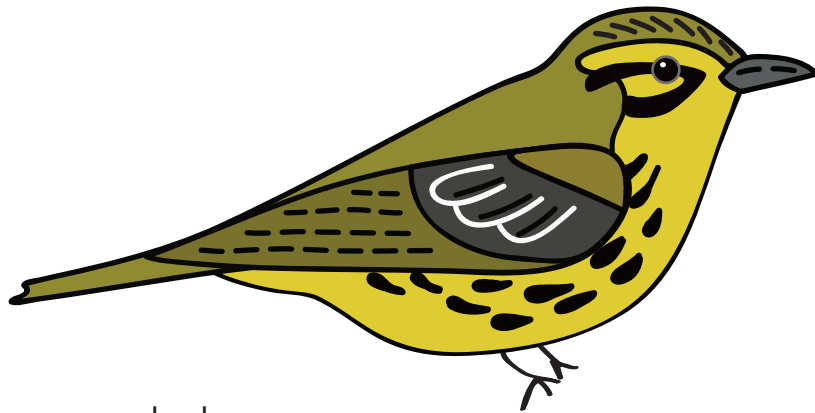


# Downeast Thunder Farm Prairie Warbler Ornament

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Pin the cape into place on the body top. Sew the decorative stitches on the head. Set beak into place and tack. Place face markings in place with the top piece overlapping the cape and the bottom piece tucked under the cape; tack into place. Cut a circle of black felt for the eye (I use a paper hole punch); sew into place with a white French knot.

Pin the over-wing to the wing and then to the body front and pin into place. Sew on the decorative back stitching on the over wing and the running stitch on the wing proper.

Pin the completed body front and body back together. Use a blanket stitch to sew the two pieces together with three strands of black embroidery floss. Pause to stuff with fiberfill before finishing.

If you like, create the feet with a bit of folded wire tucked between the two body pieces.
